**A. Japan**

- Jan 2016 Halal warehousing certification received from Japan Halal Association (JHA) (Tokyo Shipping Branch)
- Feb 2016 Halal transport certification received from JHA (Tokyo Shipping Branch)
- Mar 2017 Halal warehousing/transport certification received from JHA (Fukuoka Shipping Branch)

**B. Malaysia**

- Dec 2014 Halal transport certification (MS2400-1) received from JAKIM (\*1)
- Jun 2015 Business partnership agreement concluded with Brahim's Holdings Berhad, the world's largest manufacturer of halal airline meals

\*2 Ritual cleansing refers to purifying locations that are considered unclean for halal foods (e.g., locations that have handled pork or pork-derivative products). Trucks and cargo containers to be used for transporting halal foods must be purified beforehand by cleansing them in accordance with JAKIM rules.
